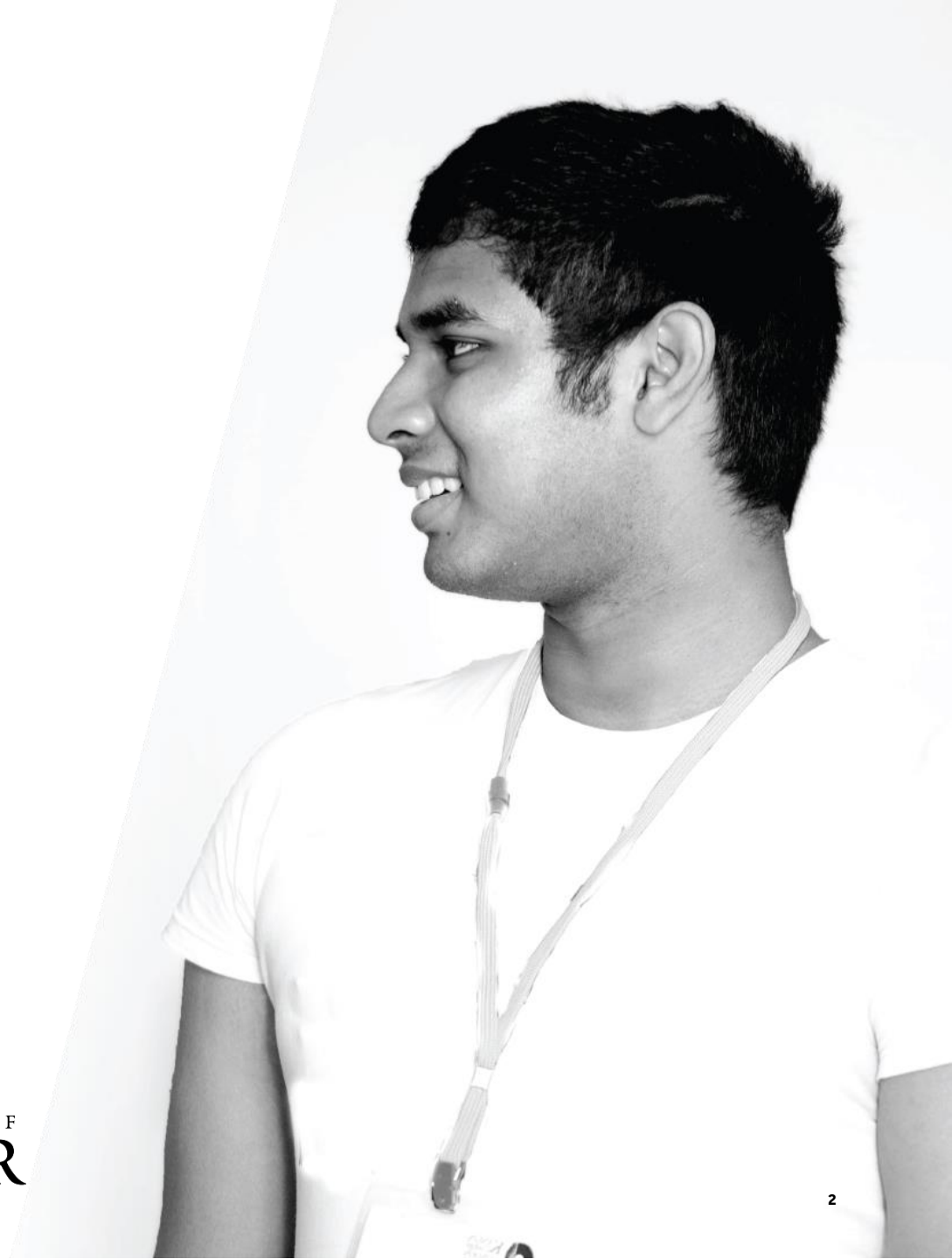

Cost of study

- Tuition fees
- Living costs
- Variety of funding strands for covering these costs:
 - Self funding
 - Loans
 - Financial Support from the university



Use of terms bursary and scholarship

- Bursary
 - Guaranteed award if student is eligible
 - Usually fairly small amount
- Scholarship
 - Competitive application process so award not guaranteed
 - Usually much larger amounts, might cover tuition fees, living costs or both



Bursary

Common features:

- Used as a driver for access and widening participation
- Often tied to household income
- May not require a separate application if the student is applying for a means tested maintenance loan



Scholarships

Payments made to support students' education, awarded on the basis of a merit, personal achievement or academic ability.

Examples:

- Academic Excellence
- Sports
- Music / Choral
- International
- Travel
- Bespoke



Application process

Applying for scholarships and bursaries can vary. Scholarships' application process varies considerably between institutions.

Things to consider:

- Eligibility criteria
- Deadlines
- Amount awarded
- Terms and conditions
- Stewardships and extra opportunities
