

#### 2020 – a reassuringly normal recruitment cycle



570,475 students were accepted – an increase of 5%



No 'spike' in UK deferrals - 8% told us in June they wanted to defer, but just 5.7% went on to do so.



37% of UK 18 year olds entered Higher Education – the largest increase in a decade



23.3% of 18 year olds from the most disadvantaged areas were accepted – a record high



17% increase in students from outside EU – driven by increased growth from China, India and Hong Kong

616.3k applicants - an 8% YoY increase



Record demand from 18 year olds - up 11% YoY representing 42.6% of 18 year old population

Mature demand
continues into 2021 applicants up by 24%



Reduction in demand from EU -40% fewer applicants YoY



85.6k non-EU applicants, 12.6k (17%) YoY growth




Figure: typical routes for school leavers into different degree subject areas






Figure: an indicative comparison of what influences students' qualification choices at each stage of their education





















# **Historic Entry Grades tool**


- Accessible via the adviser portal.

- Tool shows the grades students held when they were accepted on to courses during the 2017-2019 application cycles. <u>Find out more.</u>








