Between 2019 and 2023 6.5% increase in the number of free school meal students placed at high tariff institutions

# **Concept of Widening Participation**

- Widening Participation (WP) refers to initiatives aimed at increasing access to Higher Education Institutions for underrepresented groups
- Despite efforts, data insights reveal gaps
- WP students are less likely to apply to Russell Group universities compared to non-WP peers
- Barriers faced include finance and social capital
- Not a reflection of abilities or potential




# WP and Russell Group universities

### Data insight – University of Warwick Attainment


